

Solo men 'do worse'

WOMEN who live alone cope better than solo men, a new study claims.

An Edinburgh Uni study found male singletons suffer more health, cash and housing problems than females.

With the proportion of one-person households set to reach 44 per cent by 2031, solo-living men are also likelier to work long hours and feel isolated.

Prof Lynn Jamieson said: "There are implications for income support, health and housing."
