

ICU Summer School Research Programme

Structure of 3 days

The three days are structured to give room for:

- Presentation of projects in safe and facilitated peer group discussions. The presentation of participants' poster will take place in the morning group sessions. Participants are allocated to groups to ensure a broad common interest, shared by people from different countries and with different professional backgrounds.
- Deepening understanding of methodological approaches to key issues. This is enabled by keynote plenary lectures on key issues in the morning, followed by keynote lectures of methodological approaches to addressing these, in the afternoon. The afternoon group work will take the form of 'masterclasses' where particular methods or methodological approaches are presented and discussed. In these sessions participants mix according to interest, and this provides another opportunity to meet and network.
- Networking opportunities. This is enabled by morning sessions and evening free-time providing both structured and free networking opportunities respectively. The networking activities are structured so that in the last session there will be room to progress and agree plans for future collaborations, both on an individual basis and for the network as a whole
